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

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### INTRODUCTION DESCRIPTION OF PURPOSE AND CONTENTS OF TECHNICAL REPORT

The Massachusetts Tobacco Control Program was launched in October of 1993. At that time, the Center for Survey Research conducted the Massachusetts Tobacco Survey (MTS), a comprehensive survey of adults and teens living in Massachusetts. The purpose of the survey was to collect baseline data on the prevalence of tobacco use among adults and teens in the Commonwealth and on issues related to the likelihood of smoking cessation or initiation. The survey also assessed the prevalence of restrictive smoking policies, and attitudes about tobacco control measures. The baseline data serve as a standard against which the impact of various programs sponsored by the Department of Public Health can be assessed. Technical details about the MTS and reports of the results are available from the Massachusetts Department of Public Health.<sup>1</sup>

In January, 1995 the Department of Public Health contracted with the Center for Survey Research to carry out a second survey monitoring tobacco use and related attitudes and behaviors among adults in the Commonwealth. This second survey, known as the Massachusetts Adult Tobacco Survey (MATS), has been carried out monthly since March of 1995. Data are aggregated at the end of each calendar year. MATS is similar to the MTS in that initial screening interviews are carried out with a household member who provides demographic and smoking status information about other adults in the household. One member of the household is then randomly selected for extended interview. The annual sample for this survey is smaller than that used for the MTS and does not include teens. It also differs from the MTS in that smokers were not over-sampled, nor were members of minority groups. The sample was geographically stratified as was the MTS. (More details on the sampling design are presented in Chapter I.)

Technical Reports are available for the 1993 MTS survey, and for the 1995 through 1999 MATS surveys. Please refer to those reports for descriptions of the respective surveys and a more general discussion of the use of the telephone survey for data collection. This report presents methodological details of the 2000 MATS. It contains an appendix of tables of major results for data collected each year. Nontechnical reports describing the major results are available from the Massachusetts Department of Public Health.

## CHAPTER 1 SAMPLE DESIGN

The sample for the 2000 Massachusetts Adult Tobacco Survey is a complex design using stratification. The strata correspond to six designated geographic areas of interest, as follows:

- Boston
- Springfield
- Worcester
- Lawrence and Lowell
- Fall River and New Bedford
- The remainder of the state not included in the previous five strata.

The overall sample of 10,420 telephone numbers is distributed among the six strata in approximately equal proportions.

#### **RANDOM-DIGIT-DIALING TECHNIQUES**

Beginning in November of 1997, and continuing throughout 1998, 1999, and 2000, the GENESYS system was used to select a sample. The GENESYS system is a list-assisted sample selection procedure which identifies all residential clusters of 100 telephone numbers that have at least one published residential number. These clusters then form the sample frame for selection of final sample telephone numbers. The advantage of the GENESYS system is that since all possible clusters are used to create a sample frame, the final sample is not clustered as in traditional random-digit dialed (RDD) samples. The GENESYS system has proven to be a very effective strategy for RDD samples in recent years.

Table 1.1 displays the final distribution of telephone numbers dialed. The probability of a dialed number being residential is 0.563. This is down from 0.61 in 1997, 0.643 in 1995, 0.614 in 1996, 0.572 in 1998 and 0.568 in 1999. This trend is not unexpected with the increased use of in-home fax and computer lines and with the increased use of cellular phones.

#### **RESPONSE RATES**

Overall, a total of 3713 preliminary household interviews were conducted, for a household response rate of 70.3%. In order to compute this response rate, one assumption was necessary. Although great effort was expended in attempting to make contact with each telephone number dialed, some numbers produced only "no answer" as a result of each dialing. To estimate a response rate (the percentage of all sampled residential units at which an interview was conducted), it is necessary to make an assumption about how many of the "no answer" numbers actually led to eligible households. Based upon results from similar studies conducted by CSR in which the residential status of a random sample of such telephone numbers was confirmed by the telephone business office, an estimate of 4% residential is assumed. This rate was applied to all noncontact telephone numbers and went into the computation of the response rate. Household response rates were computed using the following equation:

The number of residential telephone numbers found included 4 percent of all noncontact households. Table 1.2 shows the household response rates for each stratum. Response rates were fairly consistent ranging from a low of about 69 percent in Fall River/New Bedford to a high of about 71 percent in Springfield. The primary reasons for nonresponse were refusals (73 percent of all nonresponders) and people who were contacted but then did not respond after a large number of call attempts (9 percent).

The overall household response rate of 70.3% was higher than the 69.0% accomplished in 1999 and the 68.5% obtained in 1997, but was lower than the 70.7% accomplished in 1998, the 75.8% accomplished in 1995 and the 72.5% in 1996. We are very pleased with the stability of the response rates across 1997 through 2000. This was accomplished with a large effort and in the face of a national trend of lower response rates to RDD surveys reported by many of the best national survey centers. Many reasons are cited for this decline including the fact that people are bothered at home more often these days by telemarketing, the use of caller ID, the increased use of using answering machines to screen calls, and simply busier paced lifestyles. Probably all play a role, but the result is difficulty in maintaining high response rates, even though more effort is being expended by field staffs to do so. In 2000, people who initially refused were not only called back once but twice in an attempt to get the respondent to reconsider. This was unheard of as recently as four years ago. A discussion of the problem of declining response rates can be found in Survey Research (Volume 29, Number 2, 1998), a publication of the Survey Research Laboratory of the University of Illinois at Chicago. The fact that we were able to maintain our response rates from 1997 to 2000 is a testament to the dedication of our interviewing staff and telephone room managers.

After completion of the household interviews, interviewers attempted to complete extended interviews with objectively selected adults 18 years of age or older. Table 1.3 displays the final results of these extended adult interviews by stratum. The adult interview response rate was 81.3 percent and ranged from a low of 78.3 percent in Boston to a high of 84.6 percent in Worcester. This response rate was computed as follows:

The largest component of nonresponse was refusals at 61 percent of all nonresponders. The overall adult response rate of 81.3% was the highest rate we have ever obtained, but is still fairly consistent with the almost 81% obtained in 1998 and the 79%-80% rates from the other years. It reflects a large effort to interview anyone who has completed the screener. An example of this effort is the breakdown of the nonrespondents. In 1995, only 29% of all nonrespondents at this stage of interviewing was due to refusals while 48% was due to inability to reach the selected individual after completing the screener. Now, the percentage of nonresponse due to refusals is at 60 percent. A great deal of effort is expended in trying to reach everyone who is known to be eligible for an interview.

### CHAPTER 2 SURVEY DESIGN

The Massachusetts Adult Tobacco Survey consisted of two interview protocols:

- A brief survey, to be answered by an informed adult household member, about the smoking status of all adults and about demographic information such as age, sex, ethnic identity of all household members and educational attainment of each adult.
- An adult interview schedule regarding smoking history, efforts to quit smoking, exposure to second-hand smoke, policies regarding smoking that affect respondents' lives, and opinions about various issues related to smoking. The interview questions varied depending on whether the respondent was a smoker, a former smoker, or a non-smoker (had not smoked 100 cigarettes in his/her lifetime).

#### INSTRUMENT DEVELOPMENT AND TESTING

The data collection instruments used in the MATS contained many of the same items included in the MTS in order to be able to assess persistence or change. New items were added at the time of the MATS startup, as well as periodically during MATS fielding, to track exposure to the various program interventions and attitudes toward newly emerging issues. Table 2.1 lists the concepts measured on the MATS and indicates whether they also appeared on the MTS, whether they were new to MATS, or whether they were just added during the most recent year of data collection. The design of the instruments was a joint effort of Center for Survey Research staff and staff members from the Massachusetts Department of Public Health.

Before beginning the survey initially, near-final survey instruments underwent a detailed pre-test under realistic conditions. Pretest samples were drawn through a combination of random-digit dialing and networking to people who were known to CSR employees, but not involved in the survey research process.

At the time the survey began, questions were evaluated in four ways. First, all interviews were tape recorded with respondent permission. For items new to the MATS interview, the behavior of respondents and interviewers was coded using special behavioral codes. These identified the rate at which questions were read exactly as worded, for which probing was required in order to get an adequate answer, and for which respondents asked for clarification. These behaviors have been shown to be reliable indicators of question problems<sup>2</sup>. Second, interviewers were given rating forms on which to record whether each question posed a problem by virtue of being difficult to read or difficult to answer. Third, after the field pretest, when behavior coding and interviewer rating forms had been tabulated, interviewers gathered in a traditional debriefing. At that session, interviewers discussed with investigators their experiences with the questions. They also helped to diagnose the problems that showed up in the behavior coding. Finally, for selected questions, the actual pattern of responses was tabulated to make sure that distributions and answers corresponded with expectation. In general, after the extensive testing that had gone on previously, we found these survey instruments to be very sound. However, the instruments were further improved in numerous ways based on the results from the pretest. Subsequent MATS survey updates have occurred several times a year on average, but cognitive interviews were not conducted each time.

#### **TRANSLATION PROCEDURES**

After the English version was finalized, professional translators converted the instruments into Spanish. When translations were completed, they were independently back-translated to English. The back-translated versions were then compared to the original English version. Discrepancies were resolved during meetings attended by the primary translators, back-translators, and CSR staff. This ensured that the translated instruments have the intended meaning to the greatest extent possible. The Spanish language interview was programmed into the CATI version.

### **CHAPTER3** DATA COLLECTION AND PREPARATION

#### OVERVIEW

The survey was conducted using a Computer-Assisted Telephone Interviewing software package called CASES<sup>®</sup>, published by the University of California at Berkeley. The sample consists of sets of telephone numbers, generated as described in Chapter 1, which together constitute a probability sample of all housing units with telephone service in the Commonwealth. When an interviewer begins work, the CATI system selects a telephone number from the sample and displays it on the screen for the interviewer to dial. The first task of the interviewer is to ascertain the status of that number. If it is not a working residential number, it is dropped from the sample. If it is a working residential number, the interviewer's task is to complete the brief household interview. As mentioned earlier, the household interview serves two basic functions: it obtains information about the smoking status, age, gender, and ethnic background of all persons 18 or older residing in the household; and it generates a listing of adult household members that forms the basis for selection of adults for the in-depth interviews.

Any English or Spanish-speaking household resident eighteen or older can provide the information for the screening interview. The interviewer then takes steps to complete the extended interview as well. If the extended interviews can not be completed at the same time that the household interview is completed, interviewers continue to call the household as necessary.

#### **COMPUTER-ASSISTED TELEPHONE INTERVIEWING**

Computer Assisted Telephone Interviewing (CATI) accomplishes three important tasks: first, the system manages the sample. Selected telephone numbers are loaded into the system and the CATI system systematically goes through available numbers and assigns them to interviewers for coverage. The system gives priority to prearranged appointments or times that interviewers enter as likely times to find particular respondents at home. Second, the CATI system provides interviewers with the questions they are to read. One of the distinctive advantages of CATI is that complex instructions for question order, based on answers to previous questions, can be programmed into the system. This capability leaves interviewers free to concentrate on interacting with respondents; interviewers simply read the questions that appear automatically on screen. Finally, the CATI system provides for entering data directly, rather than by writing answers in an interview booklet. Interviewers record answers by keying numerical codes into the computer. The CATI system prevents interviewers from entering out-of-range codes, and sometimes forces interviewers to acknowledge their entries, thus minimizing random keying errors. There are also options available for interviewers to record notes and verbatim responses as needed.

#### **INTERVIEWERS**

An essential part of any survey operation is the field staff who does the interviewing. A total of 31 interviewers worked on this project, a mixture of experienced and newly recruited interviewers. All CSR interviewers received a minimum of four days' training on standardized, non-directive interviewing techniques. In addition, they all received specialized training in the procedures and objectives of each survey.

#### SUPERVISION

Part of the quality control program at the Center for Survey Research involves continuous monitoring and supervision of interviewers. Specially trained supervisors monitor a sample of each interviewer's work on each shift. Monitoring includes listening to a segment of an interview and systematically recording the extent to which interviewers adhere to standards for good interviewing practice: asking questions exactly as worded, probing non-directively, and maintaining appropriate, neutral rapport with respondents. When problems are identified, interviewers meet with a supervisor after the interview is complete to discuss the problem and identify its source; retraining is initiated as needed.

#### FIELD PROCEDURES

A total of 6115 interviewing hours and 1249 supervisory hours were expended on the project over a total of 352 shifts. An additional 351 hours were spent in briefings and conducting clerical tasks. Shifts were five hours each, on average, running from 4:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday, 3:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Friday, 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on Saturday, and 4:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m on Sunday. Occasional shifts were held earlier in the day to help ascertain the status of numbers not answered during regular shifts and to cover appointments made with respondents.

The sample began with 10420 telephone numbers, of which 5450 were residential (5418 were confirmed residences and another 32 were deemed likely residences). See Chapter 1 for details of the results of the field work, including response rates.

When an interviewer called a new working telephone number, the first step was to ascertain that it reached a residence. Upon establishing contact, the interviewer introduced the study, explained the purposes and sponsorship of the research, assured respondents of confidentiality and the voluntary nature of their participation and asked whether a responsible adult would complete the screening interview. The screening interview required 4.95 minutes on average.

If no one answered, callbacks were made at different times of day, and on different days, up to a minimum of ten calls. If there still had been no household contact, interviewers waited a week or two, and then tried the number again, to reach households where people were away for short periods. Very few households reached a final status of "no contact." Those that did had been called an average of 16.62 times.

If the person who initially answered the telephone was reluctant to be interviewed, interviewers made every effort to provide information that respondents might need to consider participating and attempted to make it possible to call back later. Initially reluctant respondents were recontacted a minimum of four days after a refusal occurred and efforts were made to convince an eligible adult to complete the household or extended interview. Successful refusal conversion resulted in 478extended interviews. Initial refusals were given by 2,195 households; thus, interviewers were able to convert 21.8% of all initial refusals to extended interviews.

Once the screening interview had been completed, interviewers attempted to complete the extended interview with the selected adult on the same call. Failing that, they tried to find a time when they could reach the designated respondent. Once again, a minimum of ten calls were made to the household to arrange an interview with difficult-to-reach respondents; in many cases, more than ten calls were made. Households which completed the initial screening interview, but failed to complete the extended interview received an average of 18.61 calls. Table 3.1 shows the distribution of calls made across different results.

If the designated extended interview respondent was different from the household interview informant, the study was reintroduced, including all necessary information about sponsorship, purposes, and confidentiality. Extended interviews were an average of 22.39 minutes in duration. Screening and interviewing required 2.06 hours of interviewer effort per completed long interview. This includes time spent reviewing feedback from supervisors and any retraining necessary.

Finally, a special challenge of this study was the desire to collect data from some respondents who did not speak English but could speak Spanish. Whenever possible, interviewers asked respondents if they would feel comfortable being interviewed in English. If they did not, and they spoke Spanish, the household was assigned to a Spanish-speaking interviewer. In all, 140 interviews were completed in Spanish.

#### DATA CLEANING

The data were cleaned after each six months of data collection. The first part of the cleaning process checked the existing data and produced a printout displaying the values of selected variables before and after cleaning. The printout from the checking process was reviewed to see if any interviews were blanked out, if the respondent selected for an interview was somehow different from the respondent who actually did the interview, and if there were any illegal or missing answers. Once a questionnaire successfully passed these checks, it was ready for the second part of the cleaning process, known as "certification." This process systematically went through each interview from start to finish, clearing out any "backed-over" values and overwriting the old data with the new, clean data. This process was done with an option that allowed us to salvage the data that existed prior to cleaning. The result of the cleaning process is a data file with correct skip patterns, with coded responses to open-ended questions, and with no wild codes.

### CHAPTER 4 WEIGHTS, CALCULATING ERROR VARIANCE

#### Weighting

Due to the fact that the sample for the 2000 Massachusetts Adult Tobacco Survey was drawn using a stratified design, it is necessary to use weights in order to properly adjust the sample to be reflective of the general population. The adjustments are necessary to account for oversampling of the five strata of particular interest, namely: Boston, Springfield, Worcester, Lawrence and Lowell, and Fall River and New Bedford.

The GENESYS system was used to select a random sample of telephone numbers within each stratum. Using this system, the base weights for household i within stratum k was computed as follows:

This weight represents the inverse of the probability of selection for each household in the sample. It is always a true inverse of the probability of selection as weights were not limited (trimmed) in any way to gain a potential variance reduction.

These base weights were adjusted for households which were found to have more than one telephone number that was used for residential purposes (i.e., not a fax, modem, or business line). If this situation is discovered, since the household had a higher probability of selection, then the sample weights must be adjusted to take this into account. The multiple telephone adjustment was computed as:

A second adjustment made to these weights was for nonresponse. Since response rates did vary by stratum, nonresponse adjustments were applied by stratum to account for this differential nonresponse.

The appropriate nonresponse adjustments were computed as:

These weights represent the probability of selection for a sample household adjusted for number of telephones and nonresponse. They are household weights. Since the file of data from screening interviews has one record for each person in the household, these weights are also person weights for the screener file. For the data from adult interviews, since one adult was randomly selected from among all eligible adults in the household, the adult household weights must be further adjusted to account for the number of adults in the household.

Final weights were computed by taking the adjusted weights and centering them around 1. This weight was computed by multiplying the adjusted weight by (n/N) where n = the overall study sample size, and N = the sum of all adjusted weights. This weight sums to the overall sample size while still reflecting basic differences in probabilities of selection and response rates..

It should be noted that this method of weight adjustment assumes that there is no differential nonresponse bias. In other words, it assumes that the group of nonrespondents is, on average, similar to the group of respondents within any stratum. With the lack of any evidence to disclaim this assumption, no additional types of weighting adjustments were considered. A general discussion of how to use these weights is included in Chapter 5.

#### **VARIANCE ESTIMATION**

A problem frequently encountered with the analysis of data from complex sample designs is the computation of sampling errors. Most statistical software programs do not allow for the input of a complex sample design and assume simple random sampling. This can lead to an underestimate of sampling errors and perhaps erroneous conclusions drawn from the survey. Fortunately, several approaches have been developed for computing estimates of sampling errors from complex surveys. They include:

- Taylor linearization
- Balanced Repeated Replication (BRR)
- Jackknife procedures
- Generalized Variance Functions

The procedure selected for use with the 2000 Massachusetts Tobacco Study is Taylor linearization. This is the method of variance estimation used by the SUDAAN computer software package. For a detailed description of Taylor linearization see Wolter<sup>4</sup> or the SUDAAN Technical Manual<sup>5</sup>.

The design effects for 2000 are smaller than those reported for the 1995 through 1997 MATS. The primary reason for this reduction is a change in the sampling strategy in November 1997. This change went from a modified Mitofsky-Waksberg RDD design to a list assisted RDD design using the GENESYS system. This change eliminated the clusters that are part of a Mitofsky-Waksberg design and therefore improved the estimated design effects.

### **CHAPTER 5** INSTRUCTION FOR USE OF PUBLIC DATA TAPE

#### How and When to Use Weights

There are two distinct data files from the 2000 Massachusetts Adult Tobacco Survey; the household interview or screener file and the adult interview file. On each of these files are three different weights: the base weight, the nonresponse adjusted weight, and an overall sample size adjusted weight. Following is a discussion on the meaning of these weights and how to apply them when using the data files.

Since the data from the 2000 Massachusetts Adult Tobacco Survey came from a survey which used a stratified sample design, use of these data without using weights would lead to misleading results. Therefore, proper weighting of the data is critical for analyses to lead to correct interpretations.

*Base weight*. This weight is the inverse of the probability of selection and is the cornerstone on which all other weights are constructed. Although it is important, it should not be used in most analyses. It is included on the data files solely as a reference point for the computation of other weights.

Nonresponse adjusted weight. This is the base weight adjusted for:

- multiple telephone ownership, and
- differential survey nonresponse.

This weight has the property that it inflates the sample to population estimates. This weight should be used any time a point estimate of a population parameter is desired. For example, suppose an estimate of the number of black women who smoke in Massachusetts is needed. The nonresponse adjusted weight would be used in this instance. Likewise, the nonresponse adjusted weight would be used to estimate the number of 18-24 year olds in Springfield who smoke, or the number of people exposed to second hand smoke for more than two hours a day, or the number of Hispanics who have quit smoking within the last five years.

**Overall sample size adjusted weight.** This weight sums to the overall sample size across all strata. This weight should be used for any analyses that combine strata. For example, if an estimate of the percentage of women exposed to smoke at work is desired, then the overall sample size adjusted weight should be used. The advantage of sample size adjusted weights are that they accurately reflect the correct sample size in computer output. It may be a more comfortable weight for users of the data files with statistical packages such as SPSS, SAS, or others. Since the sample size adjusted weights differ from the nonresponse adjusted weights only by a constant multiple, the use of either in any type of statistical analysis will lead to comparable point estimates of parameters. On both the adult interview and household interview files, there are base weights, nonresponse adjusted weights, and overall sample size adjusted weights.

#### **USER CAUTIONS**

Finally, it should be noted that users of these data files should use extreme caution for several reasons. First, the data were collected and cleaned in the CASES computer assisted telephone interviewing system. Although this produces very "clean" data, there may still be values on the data files which some may wish to consider erroneous. For example, is the value of 425 pounds for a person's weight a true value or is it a respondent reporting error or an interviewer recording error? Users of these data should examine their variables of interest and make their own determinations.

Second, use of these data files without proper use of survey weights could lead to erroneous results. A description of the weights and how to use them has been included, but users should be both familiar with using data from complex surveys and with weighting in order to ensure proper analytic results.

Third, even though weights have been properly applied, most statistical software packages do not allow for the proper input of a complex sample design for the computation of standard errors. Therefore, point estimates of parameters such as means, totals, or regression coefficients may be correct but estimates of their standard errors may not. Computer packages such as SUDAAN, SUPERCARP, or WESTVARS, which allow for the estimation of standard errors from complex sample designs, can be used. Relating to the use of these computer packages is the requirement that the sample design be input into the package. For the 1998, 1999, and 2000 MATS, only the stratification variable need be input. This variable is named "STRA" on the computer files. For data from 1995 through 1997, both a stratification and a cluster variable need to be input. The stratification variable is named the same as for the 1998, 1999, and 2000 data while the cluster variable is named "NEWCLUST." The design change in November 1997 which eliminated clustering creates the need to be careful when analyzing MATS data from 1995 through 2000. In SUDAAN, the proper way to handle this problem is to state a design which has both stratification and clustering within stratum. For data prior to November 1997, the variables mentioned above can be input into the design. For November 1997 and later, a dummy cluster variable must be created. This is to inform SUDAAN that clustering did not really occur in these months. The dummy variable needs to be greater than 1000 and be unique to each observation. One way to do this is to create a sequential counter which begins at 1000 and increases by 1 for each observation from November 1997 and later. The goal is to have the dummy cluster variable indicate a one observation per cluster design. This counter is incorporated into the variable "NEWCLUST." This allows SUDAAN to properly adjust for the lack of clustering in post November 1997 data. If 1998, 1999, or 2000 MATS data is being analyzed alone, then only the stratification variable needs to be input. Users of SUDAAN or other software packages need to determine how their package can handle combining a clustered and non-clustered stratified design.

# ORGANIZATION OF TABLES

These tables present some of the major variables from the household screener and extended adult surveys carried out between 1993 and December of 2000. Tables with variables from the screener combine the results for all years. Tables of results from the adult surveys group variables by topic and are arranged so that results from each year appear on sequential pages. The exceptions to this rule are tables 7-C, 7-D, 15-A and 15-B which present cross-year data. Results are broken down by gender, age group, level of education, smoking status (when appropriate), race/ethnicity, and the five urban regions which were over-sampled. The first tables in a group are labeled "A" and present breakdowns within the largest group of respondents, one page for each year. The "B" and "C" tables show breakdowns either within gender or within nonsmokers. Since the sample size was considerably smaller in subsequent years than in 1993, and smokers were not oversampled in the later years, the sample of smokers is too small to yield reliable subgroup estimates. The last two groups of tables show results for questions initiated in 1997 and 1998.

#### SAMPLE SIZE

Many of the tables also present unweighted sample size for each subgroup examined. The sample size is the number of respondents interviewed in that category. Although the sample size estimates are the same for each variable (i.e. the number of 18 to 24 year-old female respondents is the same for items about smoking status and exposure to anti-tobacco messages), the actual sample size for different items may vary due to missing data. Population size for specific subgroups is shown in the 1993 tables. The same population estimates can be applied to data for subsequent years.

#### **MARGIN OF ERROR**

Although popular polls typically cite a single margin of error for an entire survey, in fact the margin of error within a survey varies according to the particular question being asked and the size of the subgroup for which results are presented. On Tables 1A through 1C, the 95% confidence interval (i.e. the margin of error) is presented for the estimates of current smoking status statewide and in each subgroup. For example, according to the household survey in 1995, 21.7 percent of Massachusetts adults are smokers. The margin of error for this estimate is 2.3 percent. This means that one can be 95% certain that the rate of smoking for adults in 1995 was between 19.4 percent and 24.0 percent. The margin of error is larger for small subgroups. Interpretations about large differences within small subgroups should be made with caution. For example the smoking prevalence among Black, Non-Hispanic respondents appears to rise from 21% in 1993 to 24% in 1995 and then dip to 16% in 1996. However, because the confidence intervals are so large, the differences between these estimates are not statistically significant.

For year 2000, confidence intervals were added to the entire set of tables. The point estimates were generated using SPSS to be consistent with prior years, and 95% confidence intervals were specified using SUDAAN to account for the study design. SPSS and SUDAAN use different algorithms to calculate estimates involving weighted data. As a result, there may be a discrepancy between the estimate that appears in the table and the one produced by SUDAAN. However, any difference was small, and in the range of 0.1 to 2.0 percentage points. When the discrepancy was more than 2.0 percentage points, the SUDAAN estimates were used. In some cases, prior year estimates have been corrected and are denoted by a dagger (†).
