Health Bulletin From The Health Services : The Flu

Early reports from the Communicable Disease Center of the United States Public Health Services pointed out that there was influenza in 1967-68 due to influenza A-2 virus in all but four states. In view of the periodicity of influenza little or no A-2 influenza is expected to occur in the United States during the 1968-69 season. For this reason immunization is recommended only for persons in the older age group and for individuals with chronic diseases.

In recent weeks a number of cases of influenza A-2 originating in Hong Kong have been reported in the United States in persons coming from Asia. This influenza strain represents a considerable change from earlier A-2 influenza virus, and the influenza vaccines currently available in the United States are ineffective against this new strain.

A limited amount of the older A-2 influenza vaccine is available in the Health Services. However, the University Health Services are recommending immunization only for persons with chronic illnesses such as rheumatic heart disease, high blood pressure, chronic asthma, chronic bronchitis and diabetes.
