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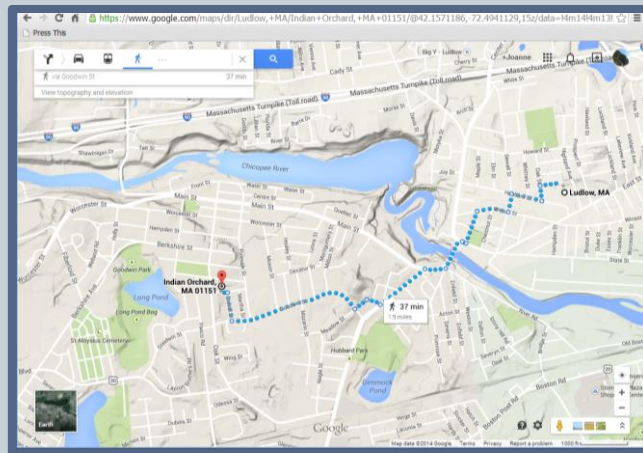

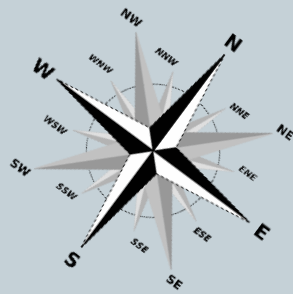
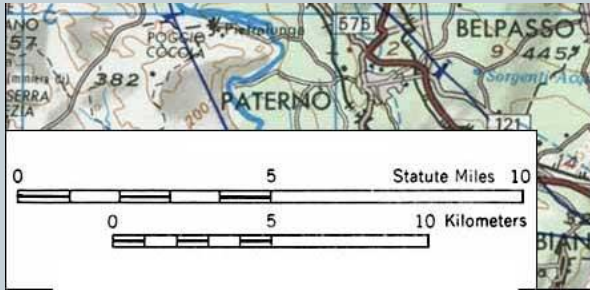

# Reality Check



- **Scale** - *relationship (or ratio) between distance on a map and the corresponding distance on the ground.*
- **Orientation** - *relationship between the directions on the map and the corresponding compass directions in reality.*
- **Legend** – *an explanatory list of symbols on a map or chart*

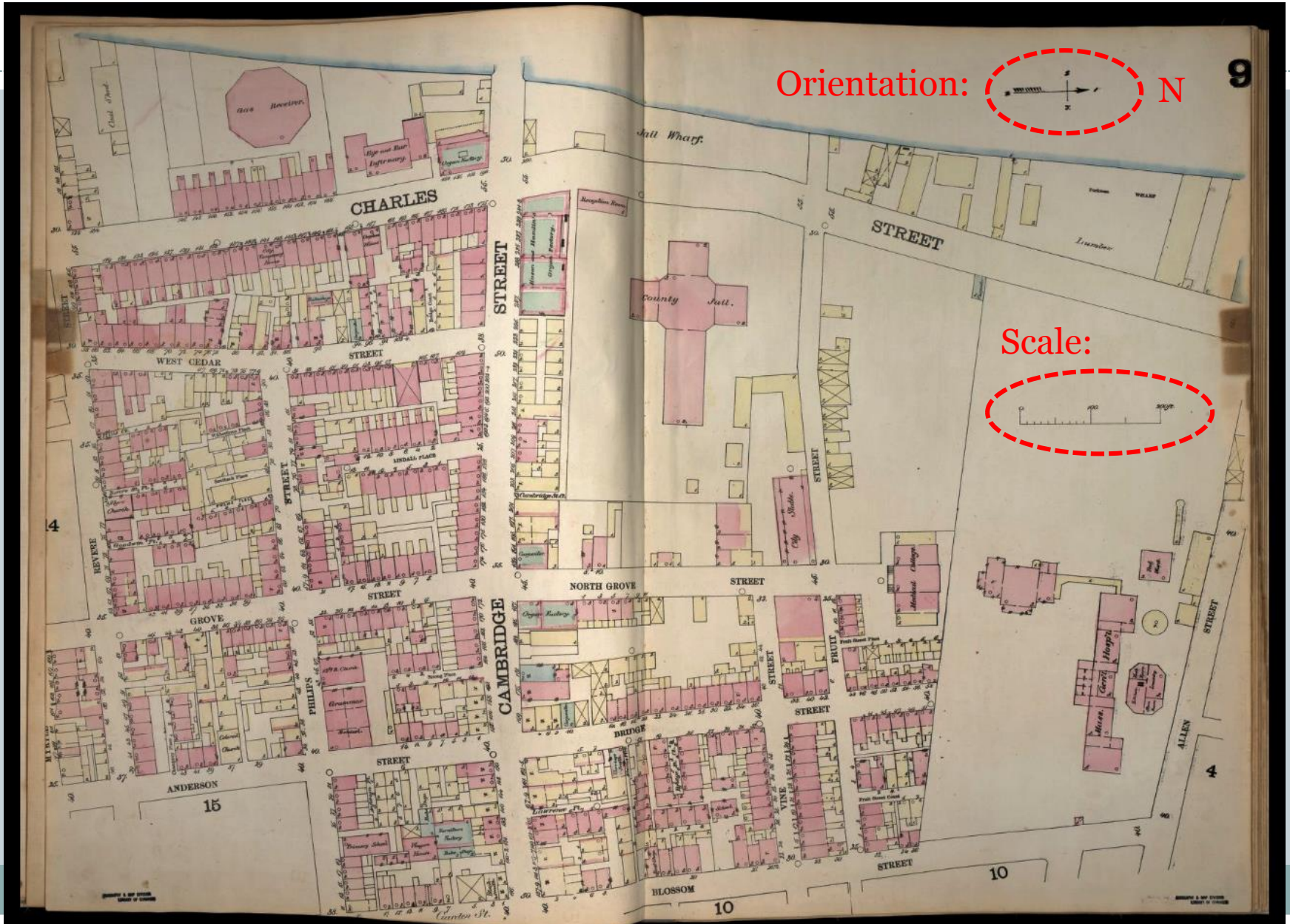


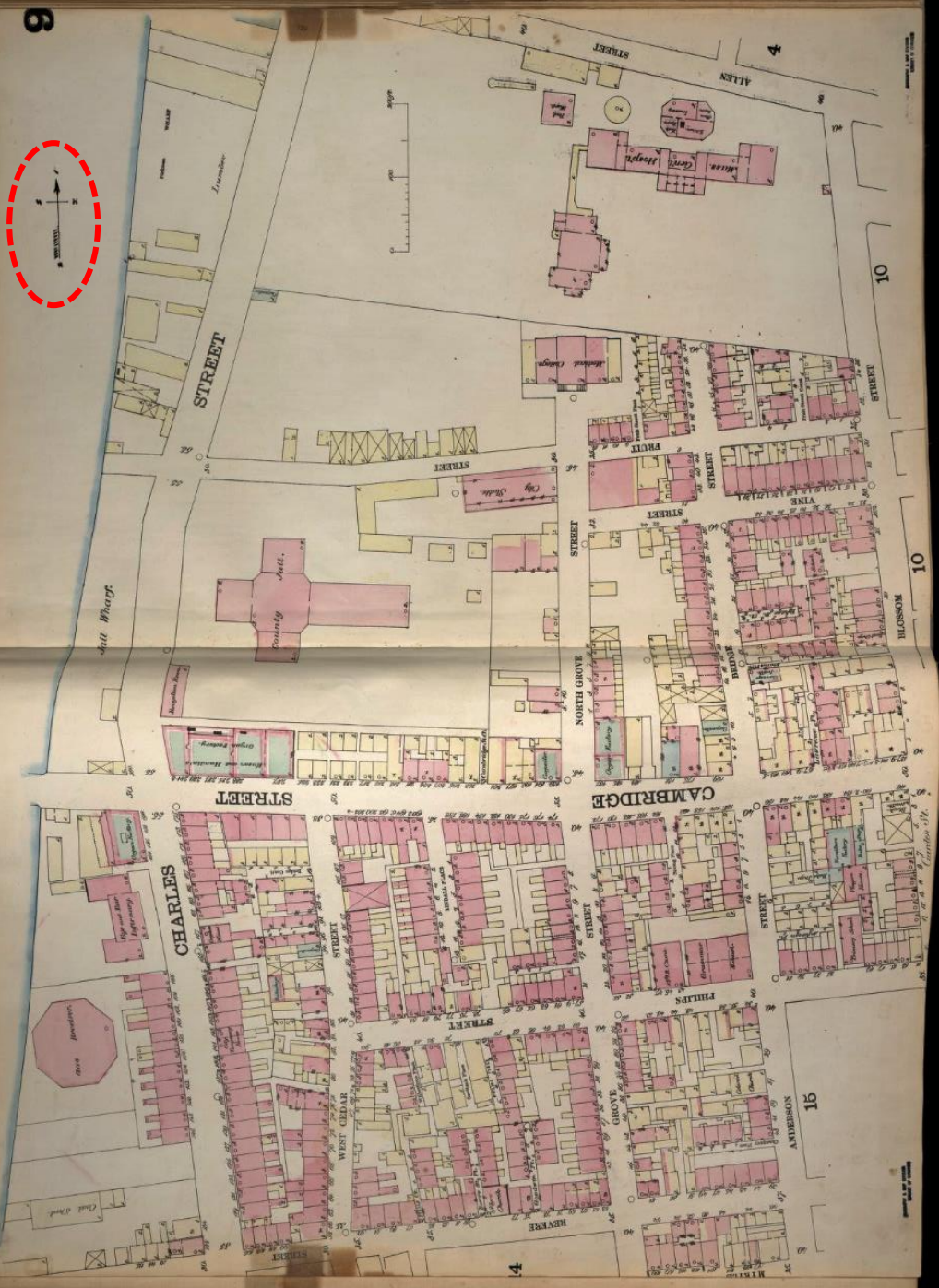


# Legend: Sanborn Map: 1867 Boston

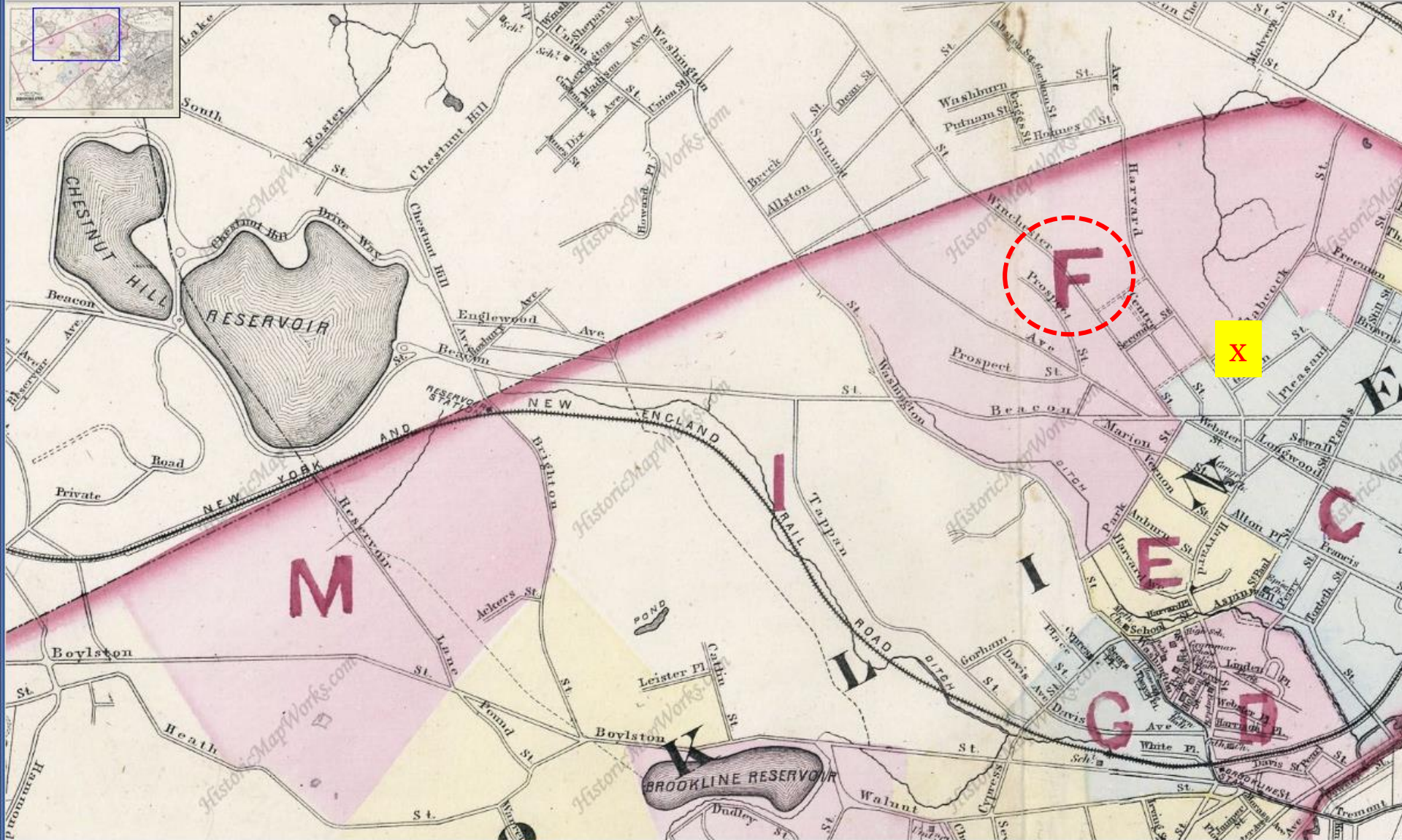

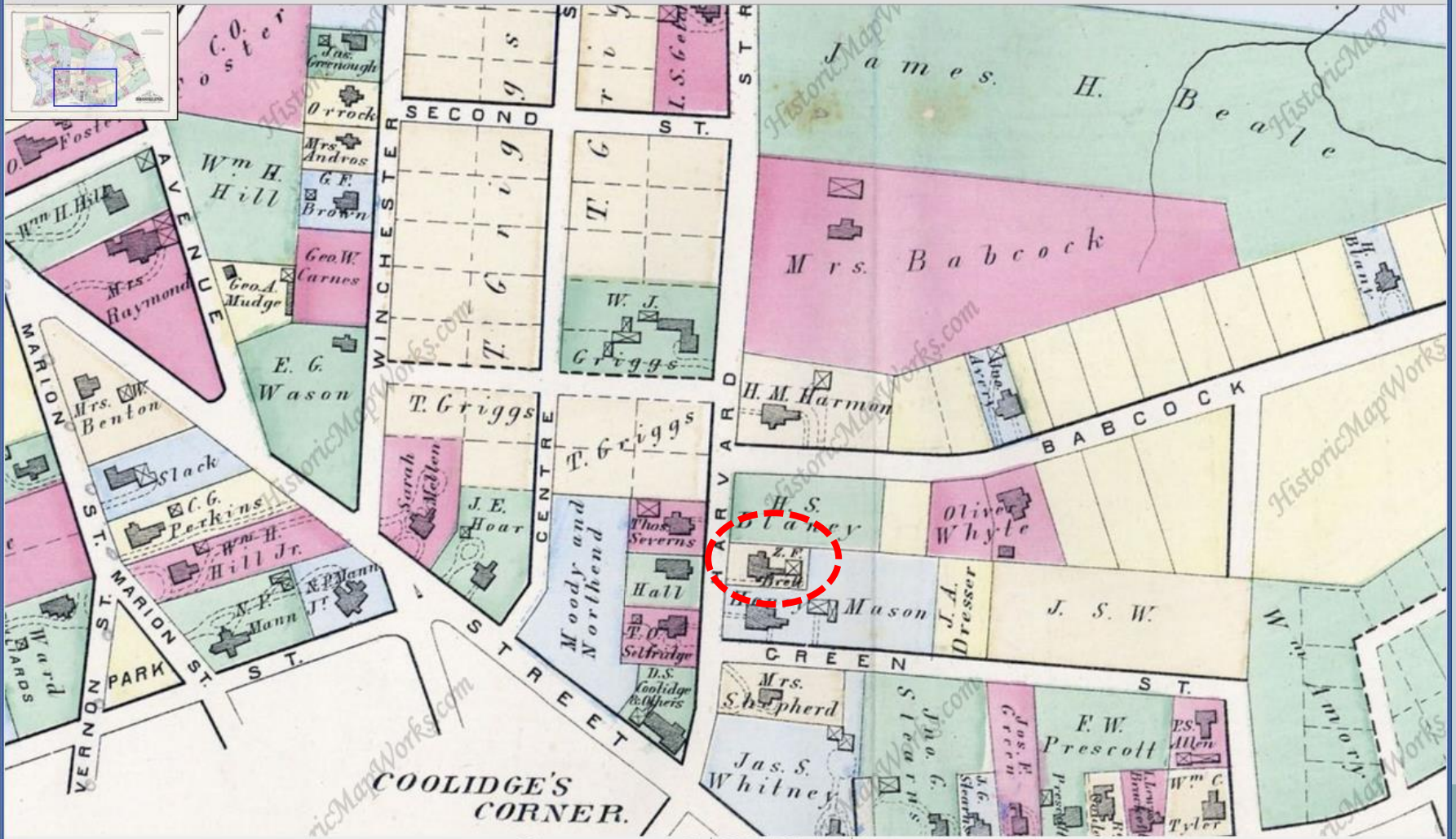


# Brookline Atlas, 1874 published by G. M. Hopkins in 1874: Zenas Brett property

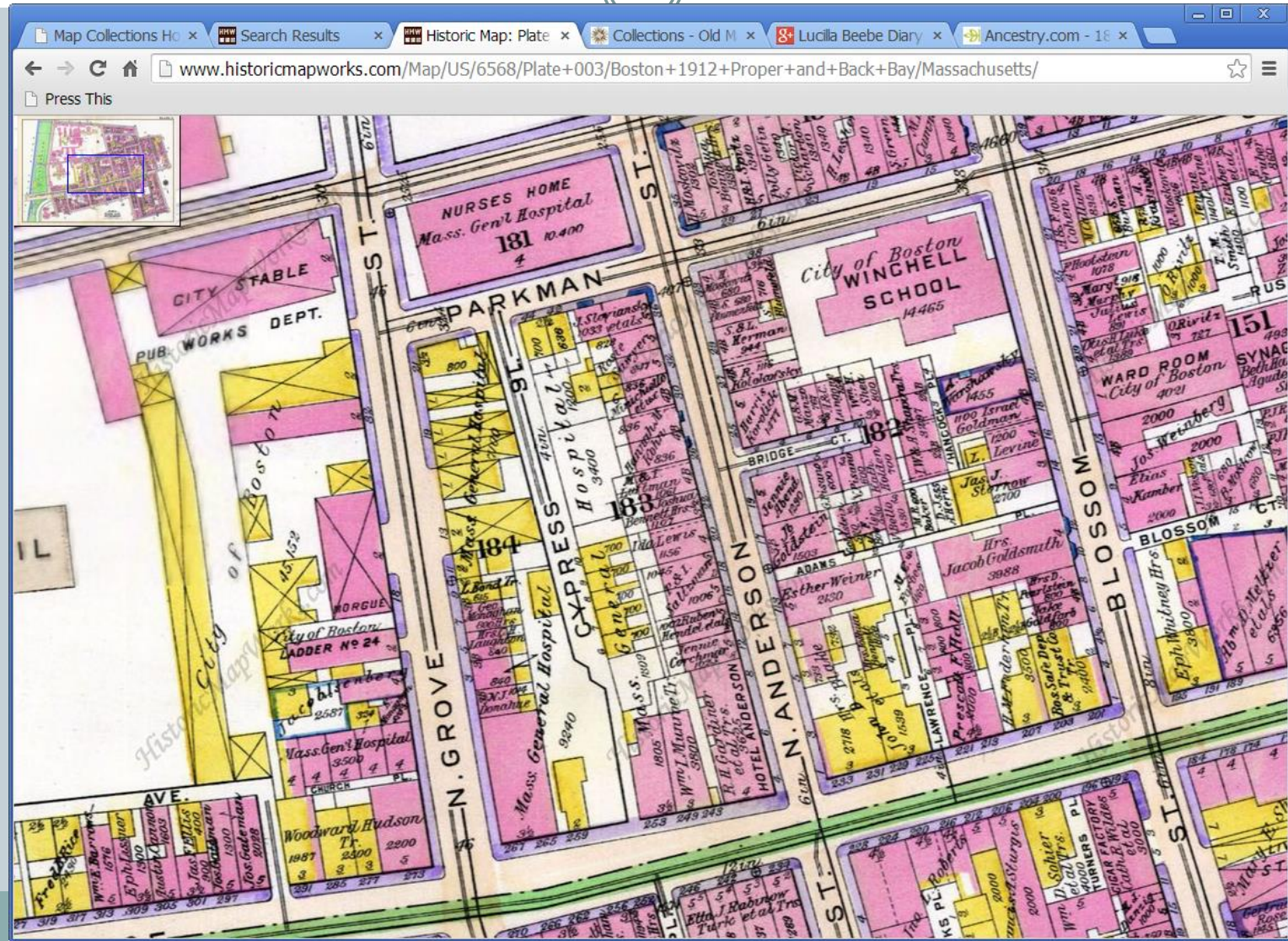

# John McNally and family lived on “**Pine Island**” in Boston City in 1870s and 1880s



- No Boston “Pine Island” in TGN or USGS
- 1880 Boston Directory – street definitions:
  - “**Pine Island**” - from Roxbury Point
  - “Roxbury Point” - from **Swett**
  - “Swett” - Northampton to **Roxbury Point**
- 1905: Glimpses of Early Roxbury say:
  - Magazine Street, leading from Dudley Street near St. Patrick's Church, was laid out in 1662, and was called Powder House Lane because it led to the powder magazine. **This magazine** was owned by the State, and **was on Pine Island, now a part of the mainland.**
- 1912: A Record of the Streets, Alleys, Places, Etc. in the City of Boston
  - “**Swett Street (now Southhampton)**”
