Law and Order is the subject of the second program in the current series of the Mass Bay TV Assembly, a University of Mass/Boston, community educational project.

The program will be aired on Tuesday, October 8th. A documentary on the subject will be shown at 6:30 and again at 8:00 P.M. on Channel 2. A panel discussion followed by live talk-back from an audience of organized viewing posts will take place at 8:30 P.M.

The panel is an outstanding one and will include such personalities as Mel Miller, editor of the Bay State Banner; Richard McEachern, Chairman of Boston Patrolmen's Association; former New York City Police Commissioner Vincent Broderick; and labor historian Thomas Brooks.

The documentary will include a "free-wheeling" dialogue between black and white community representatives and three policemen from city and suburb.

All students are urged to view this unique community educational project of the University of Mass/Boston.

There will in addition be a special University of Mass/Boston viewing post set up in Room 222 of Building I with a TV set. Professor Richard Robbins has agreed to serve as a discussant. Students are welcome to attend.
