Two exhibitions will be on view at the library until the end of February. The first, a continuing one, is an exhibit of books, manuscripts and photographs of Contemporary Boston Poets, which includes selections from Nina Adolph Alonso, Ron Schreiber and Cornelia Veenendaal of the U.M.B. faculty.

The second, <u>We Spectators</u>, is a series of photographs on loan from the Martin-Behaim-Gesellschaft of Darmstadt that is currently touring the United States. There are a limited number of catalogs

available at the circulation desk, from which the introduction reads in part:

"Man always watches man...Like a voluntary or unvoluntary witness the spectator follows the way of the world...The photographer's eye sees individually... But the spectator also mingles...the external happenings into the inner part of his phantasy, weaves them into his intentions, his hopes, and his fears... We are always taking part, we spectators."

Health Careers Summer Program for Minority Students - This program, sponsored by Harvard Medical School & Harvard School of Dental Medicine is designed to attract more minority group students into medicine and dentristry, and strengthen their academic preparation in science and mathematics. The program is designed for college undergraduates from minority groups, who have completed their freshmen, sophomore or junior years. Some freshmen will be encouraged to participate for 3 years, and sophomores for 2, although they need not make committments to do so. Financial support is provided to all those accepted into the program. Expenses totaling about \$1,000 which are covered by Harvard include: room and board, tuition, an allotment for books, and laboratory fees. Students who are dependent on summer earnings can receive a stipend and travel money on the basis of their need. The Summer session is 8 weeks long from June 24 to August 21, 1970. Registration will take place on June 24, classes beginning on June 30. Application forms may be obtained at the following address:

Applications and supporting material must be submitted immediately. Notifications of acceptance will be sent out about April 15.
