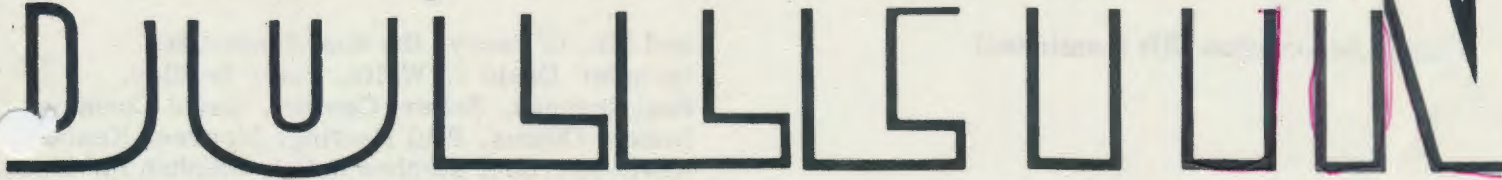

The Neighbors

Last week Dorchester and Columbia Point neighbors came to the new campus to welcome Dr. Carlo Golino as he assumed his duties as Chancellor of UMass-Boston.

The Chancellor's office was crowded with well-wishers from many organizations, including the Dorchester United Neighborhood Associations, which represents some 17 community organizations in the district, and is headed by Kit Clark. From the Columbia Point APAC were Mrs. Thelma Peters and Edward Sorrell.

The "good Neighbor" theme prevailed, and Dr. Golino stated that there are many problems to be solved jointly by University and community efforts. "We must work together," he said.

New Students

Donald Costello, Director of Admissions, in the latest report on admissions for the Fall semester, reveals there will be some 2000 new students on campus. These include 1260 students through the Admissions Office, Special Admissions, and the College of Public and Community Service; 515 will be transfers from other colleges and universities; 100 will be in the Veterans' Program and in College Prep programs; 25 in the Flexible Campus Program, and 100 associated with the Institute of Learning and Teaching.

Alumni Association Gift

Members of the Alumni Association Board of Directors at a reception for Dr. Golino presented him with a \$300 check to be used for scholarship aid to needy and deserving students. The funds came from the telephone fund raising campaign the Alumni members conducted this Spring. The Board of Directors voted for the use of the funds to help students acquire the benefits of higher education at UMass-Boston. Lana Webb Brennen, President of the Association and James O'Leary, Chairman of the Committee, made the presentation. In addition to Ms. Brennen
