Students at the Grassroots

CPDD seeks creative solutions to empower peace and development actors in fractured societies to address their complex divisions, reinforcing the commitment to principles of peace and reconciliation, and building democracy “from the bottom, up.”

We offer practical expertise across the **spectrum of conflict management and democratic governance**, guided by academic research and evaluation. CPDD is mentoring the next generation of peace and democracy builders from the UMass Boston student body, who are central to all our initiatives.



Local and Global Projects

The U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) has awarded the center a five-year grant to work with the Interfaith Mediation Centre, a grassroots interfaith organization that promotes peace across the **Muslim-Christian divide in Nigeria**.

CPDD is working with the **University of Liberia** to strengthen their public policy research and instruction, as well as expanding educational opportunities.

CPDD is working with Neve Shalom/Wahat al Salaam in **Israel/Palestine** to build exchange programs and support their development of a peace institute.

And here in **Boston**:

- Greater Boston Somali Community Dialogues – Working with members of the **Somali diaspora** to address divisions within the community.
- Assisting a dialogue process with the **Boston Busing/Desegregation Project** trying to heal some of the scars left from that tumultuous era in Boston
