Chinese Bridge Speech Contests

We sponsor and host two highly-competitive contests each year to promote Chinese language learning and teaching in the U.S.

The Chinese Bridge US High School Student Speech Contest

- Nine year long history
- More than 10,000 students from more than 100 schools in the U.S. competed
- More than 15 students received scholarships to go China

The Chinese Bridge Speech Contest for University Students in New England

- Introduced in 2011
- Nearly 100 students from UMass Boston, UMass Amherst, Northeastern University, Harvard, MIT, BU, Rhode Island, and BC competed
- Winners are awarded with free trips to China and scholarship programs at universities in China

Study Abroad Programs

Thanks to a generous support of *Hanban*, the executive body of the Confucius Institute headquartered in Beijing, the Confucius Institute at UMass Boston awards scholarships to study abroad in China each summer.

The scholarships covers all expenses incurred in China including lodging, meals, and domestic transportation.
