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Project Compass hosts Learning Community Meeting

On November 5 and 6, 2007 NERCHE held the first of two Project Compass Learning Community meetings at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Worcester, MA. Funded by the Nellie Mae Education Foundation and administered by NERCHE, Project Compass is a multi-year regional initiative to help more underrepresented students succeed in and graduate from public four-year institutions of higher education in New England. Six institutions—Bridgewater State College, Eastern Connecticut State University, Lyndon State College, University of Maine at Presque Isle, University of Massachusetts Boston, and Western Connecticut State University—were awarded planning year grants to prepare proposals for four years of implementation funding from the Foundation.
