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FACULTY RESEARCH
GRANTS

Applications for Faculty Research Grants are now invited and should be submitted before March 15. Application instructions and forms may be obtained in the Office of the Chancellor. Grants will be made available by March 30. The next deadline for applications will be June 15.

Requests ranging from a hundred to several hundred dollars are the most appropriate. Research grants are intended to support the scholarly and research activities of the faculty, with special emphasis on the opening of new fields of research, rather than on continuing support of established programs. Grants may be requested for purchase of supplies or equipment, for payment of research assistants and for travel incident to research. Requests may be made for grants to cover the cost of preparing the final copy of a manuscript for publication in nonroyalty or monograph form, including editorial assistance in typing where such is not available at the department level.

Grants will not be made to assist in the preparation of books from which faculty members are to receive royalties; to subsidize dissertations of graduate students; to defray the cost of typing a manuscript for publication in a journal or as a pamphlet.

The request should be supported by the chairman of the division.

Members of the faculty who have substantial research support from other sources are reminded that Research Council funds are limited. Priority is given to assisting research programs for which other support is not available.
