GREAT DECISIONS PROGRAM

To be read to all classes

Three University of Massachusetts at Boston students will participate in a unique radio program starting February 9, 1967 at 7:30 to 8:30 P. M. on radio station, WGBH-FM. They will be joined by Professor Benjamin Schwartz (an authority on China) and will discuss the problem, "Communist China and the United States." The program will be the first of 8 such weekly broadcasts on foreign policy as part of the annual "Great Decisions Program." University of Massachusetts at Amherst students will join our own students from WCFR in Amherst in the two-way radio broadcast across state lines. The listening audience will have an opportunity to phone-in questions.

The program will be moderated by Politics faculty from Boston and Amherst campuses. Students are encouraged to listen to these programs to call in questions to the program and form their own discussion groups. The Great Decision booklets are on sale in the Bookstore (\$2.50). Information regarding the formation of discussion groups can be obtained in Room 1222.

Some of the other topics that will be covered in the following weeks are India and Pakistan, Feb. 16; Vietnam, Feb. 23; Yugoslavia and Rumania, March 7; The Spread of Nuclear Weapons, March 9; New Deal in Chile, March 16; Nato in Crisis, March 23; The war on Hunger, March 30. Authorities in each respective area will be joined by a panel of UM/B students.
