During this summer, the construction of the new mezzanine for the Science Library is planned for the lobby area of the 100 Arlington Street building. Preliminary survey of building structure is scheduled to start on or about May 27, 1969. Construction work is scheduled to start about June 9, and finished by September 1. During most of the construction period, the lobby will be out of use and passage to other floors will be by the Piedmont St. entrance. Those who wish to take an elevator to an upper floor should walk up or down to the elevators at the second floor or the basement. Egress from all upper floors will be maintained continuously by the stairwells which exit on Arlington Street. During the period of exploratory work (May 27 to June 9) access to the main floor elevator will be maintained through the Stuart Street entrance. The Arlington St. entrance will be restricted.

All seniors who intend to participate in commencement exercises are requested to record their cap and gown sizes in the Office of Student Affairs.
