INFLUENZA VACCINATION The University Health Services is recommending annual Influenza Vaccination for persons of all ages who have chronic medical conditions such as: heart disease of any kind; high blood pressure; chronic bronchopulmonary disorders such as asthma, chronic bronchitis, emphysema, etc. Immunization Clinics will be held in the University Health Services, mezzanine, Main Building, from 8:30 until 10:00 a.m. on Tuesdays, and from 1:00 until 3:00 p.m. on Thursdays beginning on October 15. A limited amount of vaccine is available and appointments should be made by calling extension 324. Immunization is free to students; however, a nominal charge will be made to the faculty and employees.

Students who wish to DROP a course before January 8 (last day to due so) must obtain a pink DROP card from the Advising Office only, complete it, and return it to the Registrar's Office.
