Define “Open”...

Open Educational Resources (OER)

“Teaching, learning, and research resources that **reside in the public domain** or have been released under an intellectual property license that **permits their free use and re-purposing** by others. Open educational resources include full courses, course materials, modules, textbooks, streaming videos, tests, software, and any other tools, materials, or techniques used to support access to knowledge.”

Define “Open”...

Open Access (OA)

“Free availability on the public internet, permitting any users to read, download, copy, distribute, print, search, or link to the full texts of these articles...without financial, legal, or technical barriers...The only constraint on reproduction and distribution, and the only role for copyright in this domain, should be to give authors control over the integrity of their work and the **right to be properly acknowledged and cited.**”

Define “Open”...

What OA means for course materials:

No cost, available online,
free of most licensing restrictions

What OA does NOT mean for course materials:

No peer review/editorial process,
lower quality

Freely available online

(Currently 80% of journals allow this type of OA)

Open Access Mandates

- ▶ National Institutes of Health (NIH)
Grant-funded articles must be publicly accessible via PubMed Central no later than 12 months after publication
- ▶ European Research Council
ERC-funded research articles must be made publicly available no later than 6 months after publication
- ▶ UNESCO: 2012 Paris OER Declaration
“The Universal Declaration of Human Rights...states that: *‘Everyone has the right to education’*”
- ▶ UMass Boston
“The Faculty of the University of Massachusetts Boston (‘UMass Boston’) is committed to disseminating the fruits of its research and scholarship as widely as possible.”

Emily McDermott came to UMass Boston in 1974, with a BA from Bryn Mawr College and a PhD in Classics from Yale. In her time at the University, she has taught over thirty-five different undergraduate and graduate courses, including Core classes, First-Year Seminars, Honors Seminars, and (most recently) online courses. As the first among her colleagues to immerse herself in oral-Latin conventicula, she initiated the department's present seminal focus on application of second-language acquisition theory to the teaching of Latin. Her publications center on joint specializations in Greek tragedy, with particular focus on Euripides, and Augustan Latin poetry, especially Horace. Most recently, she has turned her scholarly attention to Reception Studies, publishing numerous articles on classical education through the centuries and on classical elements in authors as diverse as Alexandre Dumas, Rudyard Kipling, Thomas Hardy, Louis de Bernières, Ethan Canin, and Charles Frazier.

Administratively, she has spent ten of her thirty-seven years on campus as Chair of the Classics Department, five in the 1980's as Assistant Chancellor under Robert A. Corrigan, and seven first as Associate Dean, then as Interim Dean of Graduate Studies. From 2011 to 2014, she served as interim Dean of the College of Liberal Arts.

Copyright, Author Rights, and Open Access

UMass Boston Open Access Policy

Approved by Faculty Council, Oct. 2012

- ▶ Each Faculty member grants to UMass Boston **nonexclusive permission** to make available his or her scholarly articles and to exercise the copyright in those articles for the purpose of open dissemination.
- ▶ The university **waives application of the license** for a particular article or delays access for a specified period of time upon express direction by a Faculty member. **No questions asked.**
- ▶ The faculty member or researcher provides an electronic copy of the **author's final version** of each article to the library.

Biography

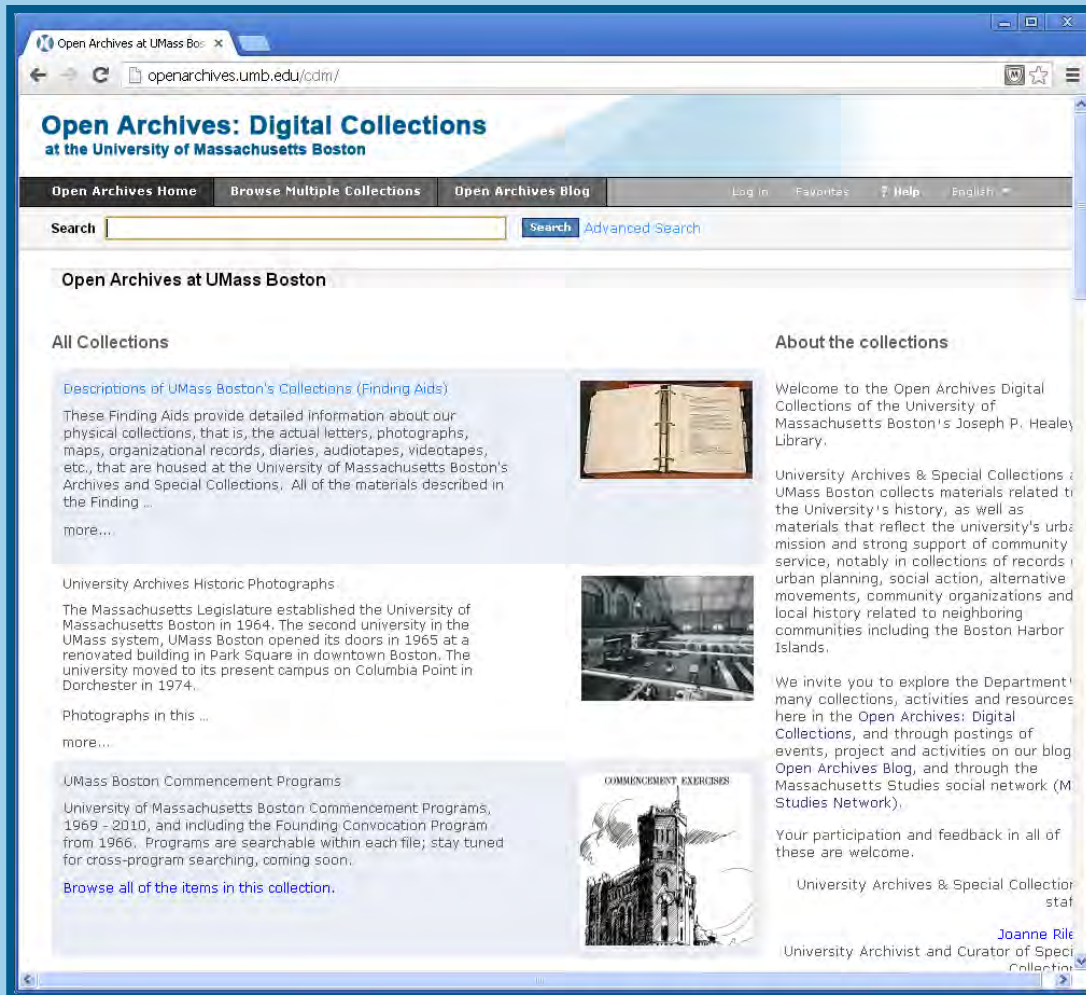
Robert Bayard Bellamy (1879-1962) was a civil engineer and surveyor who held several positions with the Works Progress Administration during the 1930s Depression. RBB's father, William Bellamy (1846-1940), was a Boston shop-keeper and author who spent the last twenty years of his life in France. RBB's father-in-law, John Norris McClintock (1846-1940), was a civil engineer and inventor of a water and sewage filtration system.

Scope and Content

The collection primarily consists of the papers of Robert Bayard Bellamy, but includes papers and memorabilia that belonged to three generations of the Bellamy family of Dorchester. Included are personal and professional correspondence, business ledgers, surveyor's notebooks, maps, bills, receipts, household accounts, school notebooks, muniments, a diary, invitations and printed material.

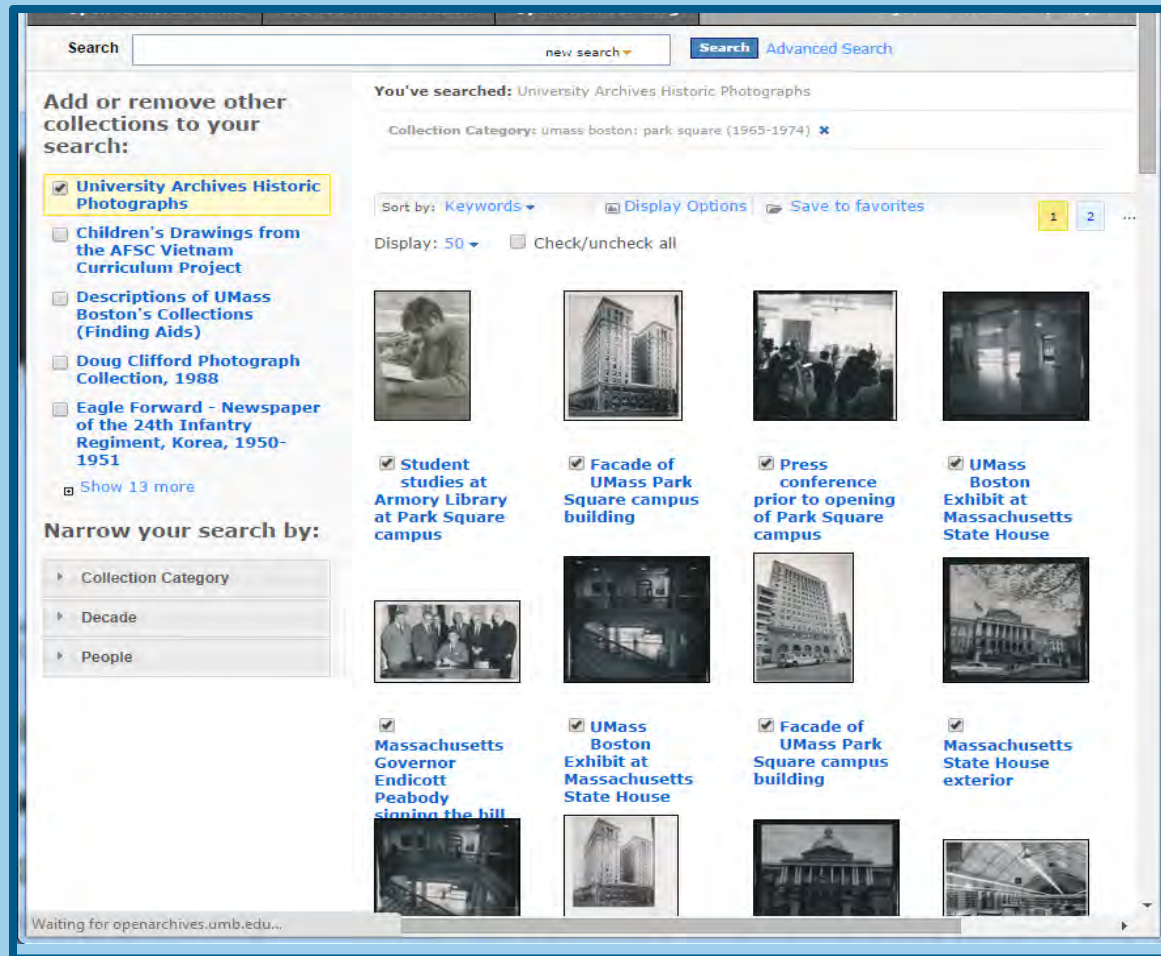

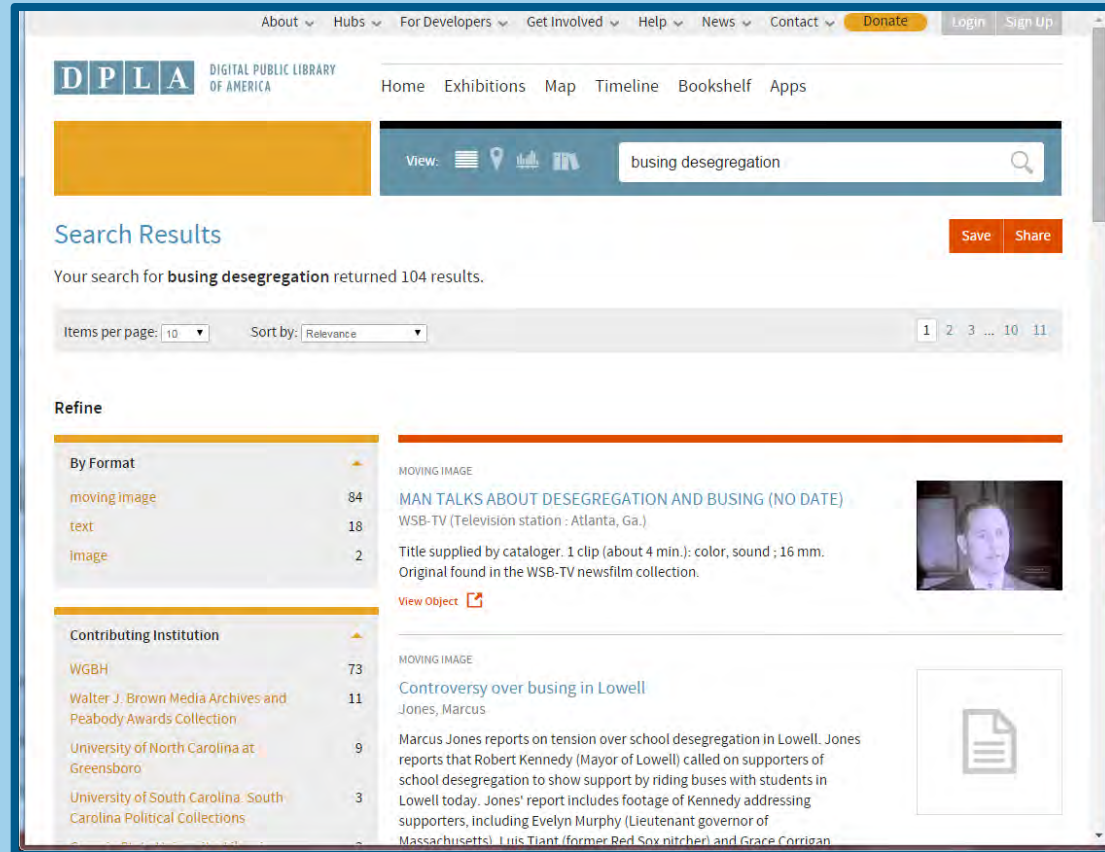

- Copyright not known or not transferred – *responsibility of the user*

► Institutional

- Permission to publish
 - Requested or required credit lines: *"Courtesy University Archives and Special Collections, University of Massachusetts Boston"*
 - Collection restrictions for privacy or other reasons (*set by donor*)
