Immunization Clinics for Travel Abroad

The University Health Services is offering to faculty and employees at a nominal charge:

Premarital blood tests and certificates

Immunizations:

Small Pox - no charge

Tetanus

Typhoid

Polio (Salk & Sabin)

Gamma Globulin

These charges were found necessary following our experience with the Immunization Clinic held last spring, and are only to cover the cost for materials. The rate schedule is available in the Treasurer's Office where payments are to be made and credited to the University Health Services Trust Fund.

MUMPS IMMUNIZATION

Mumps Live Virus Vaccine is now available and is recommended for adults, particularly males, who have not been exposed to mumps in the past.

The Health Services will have a limited number of immunization clinics for mumps vaccine ONLY on the following dates:

15	Friday	2 - 4 P.M.
18	Monday	9 - 11 A.M.
19	Tuesday	9 - 11 A.M.

Please call EXT. 324 one week in advance for an appointment so that adequate supplies of vaccine may be ordered.

There will be a nominal charge to faculty and employees to cover the cost of the vaccine and its administration.
