Chancellor

The resignation of Chancellor Francis L. Broderick, submitted to the University's Board of Trustees on June 28, was accepted and was effective at the close of business on Wednesday.

The Board of Trustees will hold a special meeting on July 7 to act on recommendations from the UMass-Boston Senate Executive Committee and the Office of the President for the selection of an Acting Chancellor.

The UMass-Boston community -- faculty, students, and staff -- extends its heartfelt sympathy to Nevin and Elizabeth Weaver on the untimely death of their son, who was killed in an air accident last weekend. The tragic death touches this campus very deeply.
